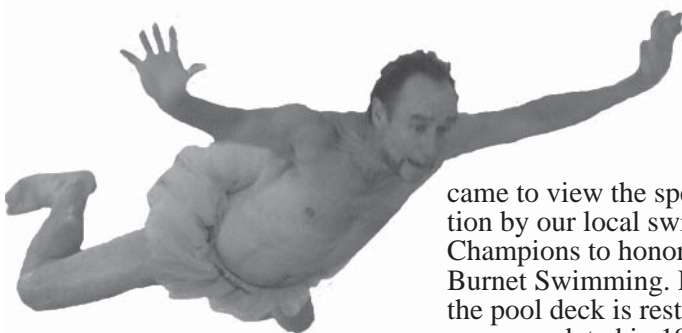

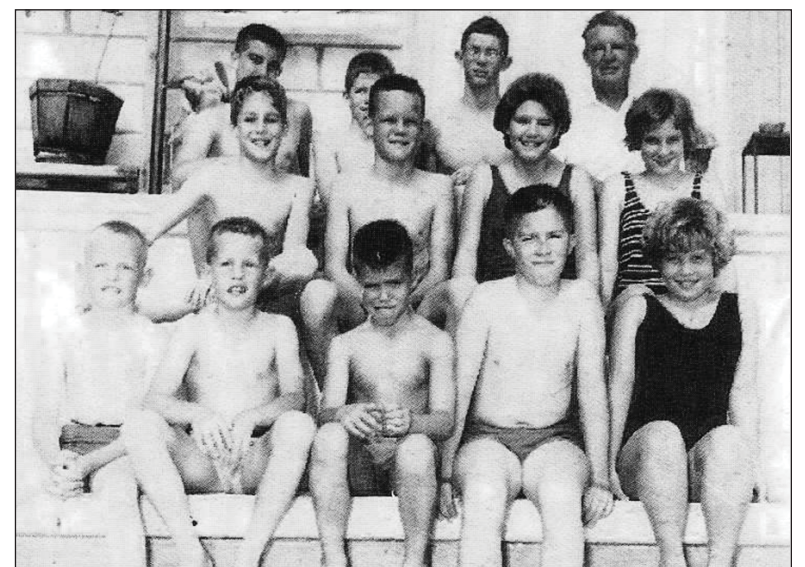
Honoring TEX!

What a pleasure and honor it is to jot down some important information about DON(FROG) and CARO(MO) THOMPSON JACKSON .. our newest ATT-AWAYTOGO Recipients! It is a wonderful and adventurous life these two have had together! DON started his camping career in the late 40's or early 50's and continued off and on until 1971. MO's journey started in 1961 as a camper in the Coot cabin and as a counselor, she continued for many years 1966-1969 and 1971.

DON and MO met here at camp .. girls swim bay to be exact and that was in 1968. DON was already in the Navy and just stopped by to help a few days .. before camp started that summer. DON FROG resigned from the Navy, married MO February 1, 1969 and on February 3, 1969 started a new job as a pilot with American Airlines.

In 1971 they came to camp as a family .. dogs and all .. for their last time as counselors! They had many moves through the years as DON flew for American Airlines over 30 years, finally settling down in Rockport, TX in 1997.

Adventure is still a big part of their lives. In 2003 they traveled from the tip of Texas to Maine and back to the Chesapeake in their 36 ft. Grand Banks trawler and 2007 bought an Airstream trailer and headed to Alaska. Gunnison, CO is a favorite place for DON's fishing and MO's painting. Through his flying years and after introducing himself from the cockpit, people often sent notes to the cockpit asking if he was DON FROG from Camp Longhorn and he is still referred to as "FROG" by many.

They now split their time between Rockport and Ft. Worth so they can spend time with son MATT and daughter BLAIR and her husband WADE CHAPPELL and grandchildren .. CAROLINE (6) and SUTHERLAND (3) .. future campers! Both MATT and BLAIR were campers and counselors for many, many years.

MO's time, when not with grandchildren, is spent with the Rockport Art Center, Art Festival, The Odyssey After School Enrichment Program and is a member of Wind Way Gallery. Don loves his time hunting and fishing and both are active in their church.

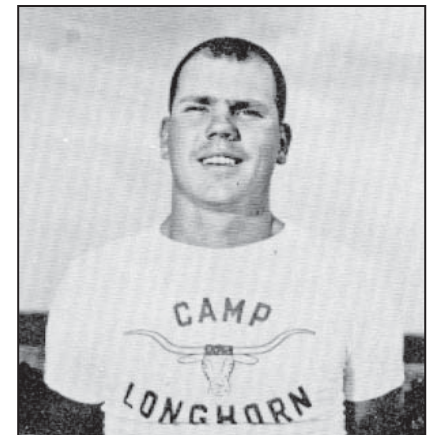

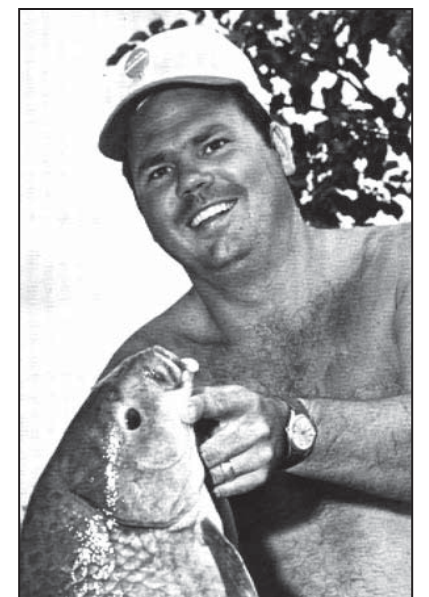

Save Yourself A Little Time . . .

HOW TO CLEAN A TOILET - TIMR SAVER

1. Put both lids of the toilet up and add 1/8 cup of pet shampoo to the water in the bowl.
2. . . Pick up the cat and soothe him while you carry him towards the bathroom.
3. In one smooth movement, put the cat in the toilet and close the lid. You may need to stand on the lid.

(After TAPS, Linger, and a few others, he would still be awake and the only slow one left I could remember was "Oh, they built the ship Titanic to sail the ocean blue." Not exactly the best newborn song!) We've told him about the activities - swimming, archery, riflery, tennis, blob, wildlife, snorkeling, etc. ELI is surprised I know how to play pickleball and water polo because of camp. I do admit that I still casually mention my canoe activity award more often than I should. My dad has talked about his lifelong friends from camp- RED DOG JONE, GARDNER PARKER, and BILL GREENHILL. And, of course, we have told him about his great-great uncle BOB flying the gumdrop plane.

There are so many wonderful friends and counselors whose names make me smile as I remember those summers. From my fellow Ponies HILLARY McDONALD and SHELLEY WATSON to my Chief girls LISA GUAJARDO and NICOLE HENRICH to SUSAN COOPER, SHANNON ELLIOTT, and KELLI RICOTTILLI and the many others in between as well as the counselors including BETH HAIRSTON, HEATHER MCGOWAN, LACY SMITH, ASHLEY BALCH, MOLLY QUIRK, MARILYN AMIS, CATHY CASTLE and ASHLEY OLLINGER. Lastly, AMY SCOTT who was my first big sister, my cabin counselor 2 separate times, and finally activity director when I was a counselor.

Camp Longhorn didn't just provide me with new friends as a camp-

awaited the letter in October with an acceptance, and now prepare to pack their trunks for 3 glorious weeks!

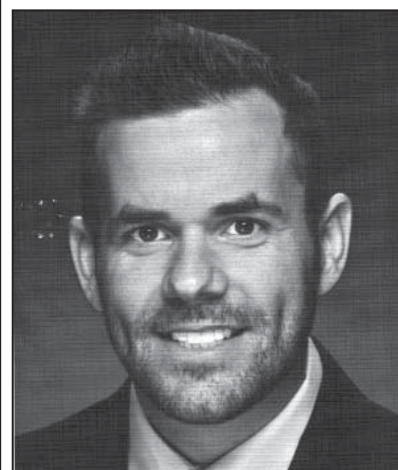

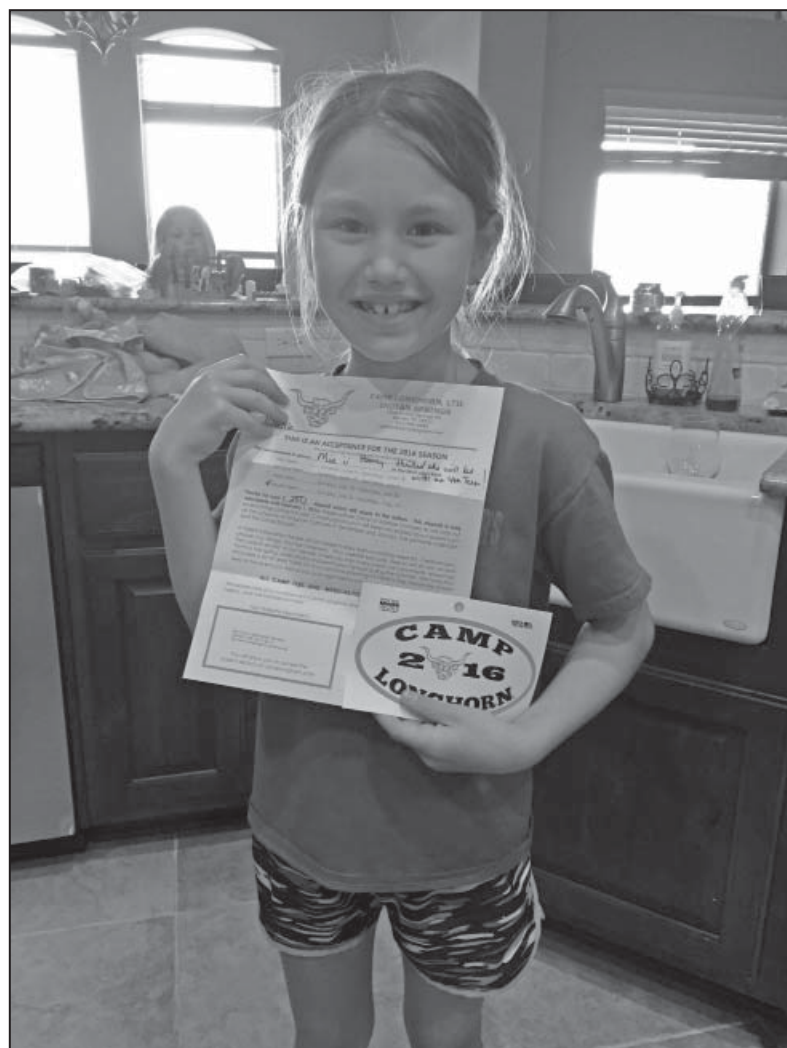
DR. CHRISTOPHER SPRADLEY

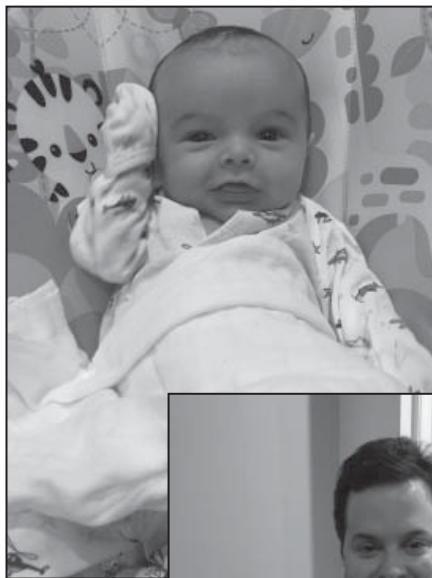

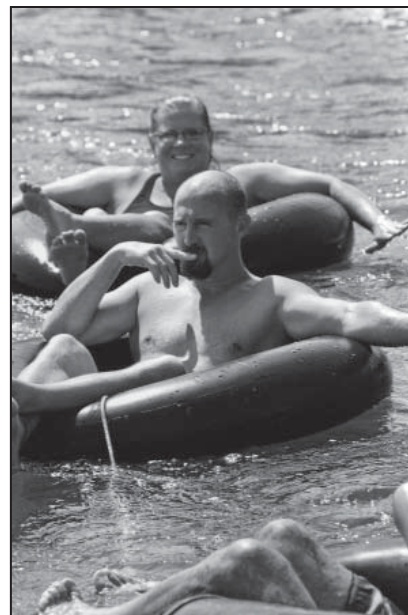

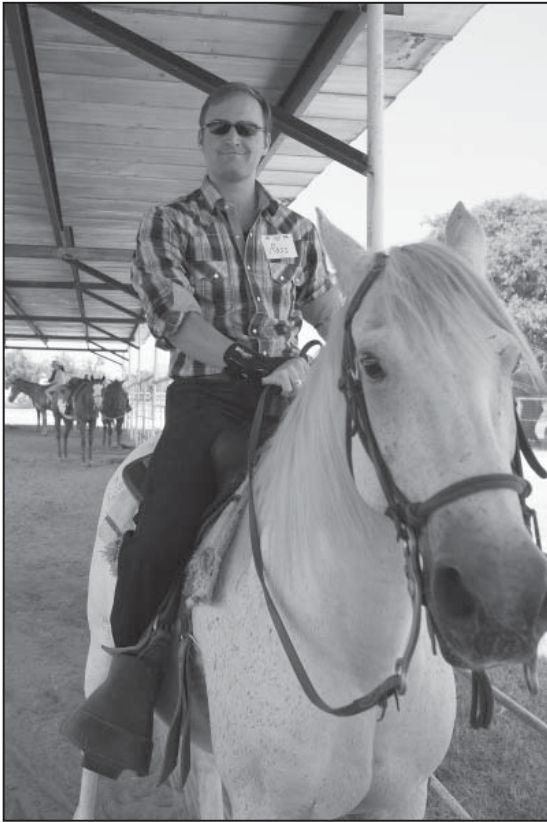

An Impact Far Beyond Camp

My first year as a camper in '96 I thought I was going to camp to get out of the house, meet new people, and have fun before I headed back to school. I didn't realize that two weeks in Burnet, Texas would change my life forever.

As a camper, I quickly realized that everybody was somebody. It seems cliché, but over the past 20 years I have experienced first-hand how that motto can change lives. You never know what is going on in a camper's life when they get off the bus, but CLH provides a place for everyone to forget what is going on in their day-to-day lives and just have fun for two to three weeks.

For six years, I had the opportunity to go to camp and develop life-long friendships with other campers, counselors and directors, before becoming a counselor. While camp has blessed me with many friends, it was a new director that I met that year that continues to have a lasting impact on the way I live my life.

When I first met DAVID BENNETT, I didn't think much of it. As an 11 year-old, I really liked his dog Mason, but I wasn't that fond of Aggies at the time. It was the next year when he helped my twin brother (and mom) get through his first year of camp that I started to realize how much he really cared about us.

As I continued as a camper, my respect for DAVID grew. However, it wasn't until I became a counselor that I got to know DAVID (and STACY) personally. Luckily for me, he took a vested interest in my success as a counselor and, even more importantly, as a person.

My first year as a counselor I came back for second term as a "Super" JC. DAVID took a chance and gave me significant responsibilities throughout the summer, many of which I was not prepared for at all.

However, he coached me along the way to make sure I was always in a position to be successful. When I was tired or worn out, he was always there to provide an encouraging word or tell me to slow down and pace myself. It seemed small at the time, but I left that summer with more confidence than ever.

Camp Longhorn and DAVID had just provided me with my first leadership opportunity and made sure I was successful.

Over the next few years, I spent my summers at camp and had the opportunity to work with some of the best people I know. DAVID and the older staff counselors continued to give me more and more opportunities and my confidence and love for camp grew right along with it. Whether it was speaking at Church Mountain or providing feedback to counselors as the Activity Director, I didn't realize that my time at Camp Longhorn was preparing me for the rest of my life.

I have had the privilege of serving as Student Body President of Texas Tech, teaching inner-city students in New Orleans, and now advising executives for Fortune 500 companies. When I think back to what prepared me for each of these, I remember many of the lessons I learned work-

ing with David.

1. Make sure people know that you care: No matter your name or title, DAVID takes a genuine interest in who you are. He asks questions and seeks to understand because he genuinely cares. I have used this lesson throughout my professional career. First as a teacher and now as a consultant, I make a commitment to get to know the people I am working with and to understand their interests and motivation. It is through these relationships I have been able to build the trust that is necessary to achieve results.

2. Don't be afraid to take a chance on someone: DAVID's willingness to trust me when I was "too young" as a JC or again as a director helped mold me into the person I am today. However, the impact was as much in the "how" as the "what;" he taught me the importance of setting expectations and providing real-time feedback to help set others up for success. As I have progressed in my career and had the opportunity to manage more people, I make a point to give my team members more responsibility and trust them to deliver, but I always start with setting expectations then spend the extra time coaching them along the way.

3. Sweat the details: Anyone who has ever been around DAVID on V-Day, knows Boys Camp will be pristine and have the cleanest libraries in camp. As a consultant, I am reminded every day how important it is to stress the details and that presentation matters. I never thought I would have learned to focus on the details by cleaning libraries the night before V-Day, but it is a lesson that I now stress regularly on my project teams.

4. Don't be afraid to roll up your sleeves and get your hands dirty: Spending fist activity plunging toilets, cleaning Boys Camp, and repairing cabins is just one example of how DAVID leads by example. DAVID taught me that no matter your title or your role, you should always be willing to do the "dirty work." Whether it's camp, teaching, or consulting, I am regularly reminded that the most successful people are those willing to go the extra mile even when it's not glamorous.

The lessons I learned from working with DAVID and the Boys Staff

had a lasting impact on me. Camp is supposed to be a place where you have fun and meet new people, but Camp Longhorn is so much more.

I had the typical camp experiences, but I also develop life-long friendships and learned important lessons that go far beyond a summer at camp. Thank you CLH.

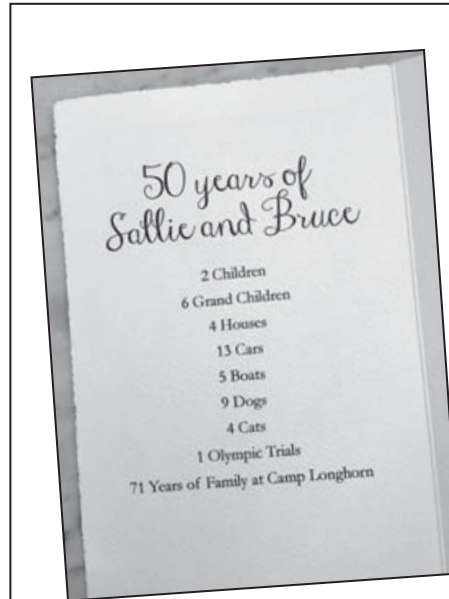

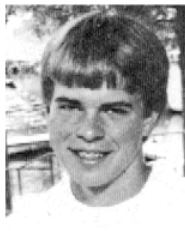

Italian Delight

From Maurine (Ama) Goodrich

This was my great grandmother/namesake's recipe, and is a comfort food staple!

Cook 1 box spaghetti.

Put 1/2 cup olive oil, skimp on it, in a skillet.

Add 2 large onions cut fine. Brown lightly.

Add 1 can tomato sauce or paste. Cook and stir until turns brown.

Add 2 pounds of hamburger meat, 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce, 1 teaspoon salt, and cook until hot and thoroughly mixed.

Add spaghetti and 1 cup whole grain com (not sweet), 1/2 cup grated American cheese, 1 can drained mushrooms.

Stir up well. Put in baking dish or pan.

Bake at 300 degrees in oven for 1/2 hour.

Grate cheese and put on top (optional).

Can add paprika before baking.

Freezes well!

Cinnamon Roll Monkey Bread

This is a Christmas morning favorite at our house! Great with coffee, breakfast casserole and fruit.

24 Frozen Rhodes Rolls (dinner rolls)

1 cup brown sugar

1 box butterscotch cook & serve dry pudding mix

1/4 cup sugar

1 tsp cinnamon

1 stick butter

1/2 cup pecans or walnuts, chopped, optional

The night before you plan to enjoy them, pour the nuts evenly in the bottom of greased Bundt pan. Place rolls into pan. Mix brown sugar and dry pudding mix together and sprinkle over frozen rolls. Mix sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle on top of that.

Melt butter and slowly pour over rolls.

Leave on counter overnight. In the morning, bake (on a cookie sheet) in a preheated 350°F oven for 30 minutes.

Remove from oven and pour rolls upside down onto a large platter.

GMom's Squash Casserole

From Martha Shipp Travis

This is a tradition at Shipp family functions! Plus, it's squash so it's healthy ... Right?!

12 medium squash (mix of yellow and zucchini)

1 stick butter or margarine

12 crumbled crackers

2 eggs

1 c. sour cream

1/2 c. chopped onions

1/2 tsp. salt

1 1/4 c. grated cheese

1 or 2 small cans jalapenos (optional)

1/2 tsp. black pepper (optional)

Cook squash until tender. Drain, cool and mash to rough texture.

Melt butter and add to squash.

Slightly beat eggs, add to squash along with sour cream, chopped onion, salt, 1 cup of grated cheese, crackers, jalapenos and pepper.

Grease 9x13 casserole dish.

Add squash mixture. Top with remaining cheese.

Bake 30-35 minutes at 325-350.

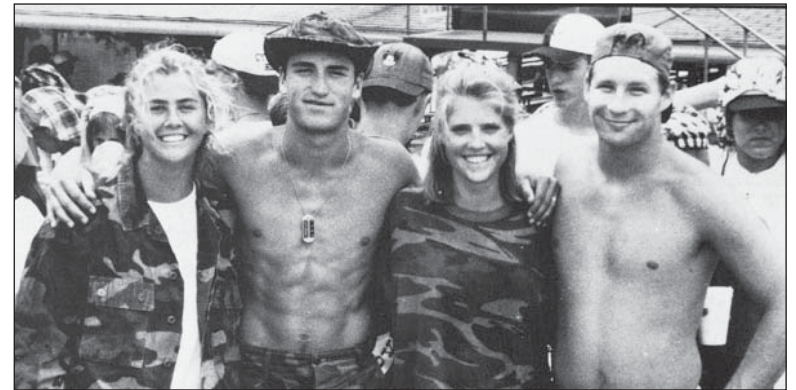

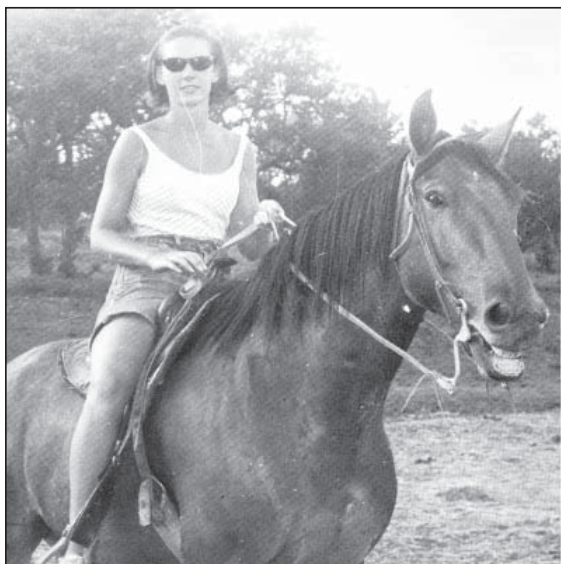

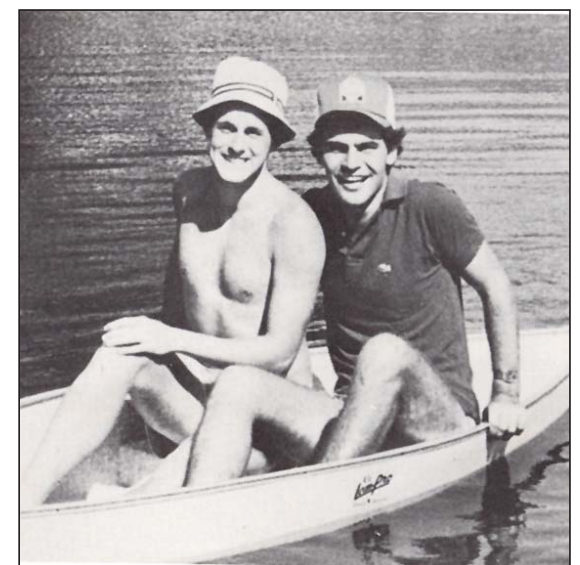
