

Two trees to be dedicated to the Fradys this summer! We will be honoring RAY and HELEN with a tree ceremony at the Inks Lake Camp and an "ATTAWAYTOGO" award this summer. Many of you know RAY passed away peacefully on February 17. Hundreds were on hand for RAY's celebration-of-life service, which was full of tributes to the man who helped shape and impact the lives of so many through his years of coaching and as a counselor and director at Camp Longhorn. With HELEN by his side for 62 years, and HELEN's 60-plus years at Camp Longhorn, they have inspired generations of Longhorn campers, counselors, staff and parents with their ATTAWAYTOGO spirit and love.

RAY and HELEN are both life-long Texans. RAY grew up in Tyler, attended the University of Texas and began his Camp Longhorn career as a counselor in 1952. HELEN grew up in Austin, attended UT and started as a counselor in the summer of 1953. Ironically, they met at UT a year later and were married just before RAY graduated in 1956.

In 1959, The Fradys were blessed with the birth of PAM. The Fradys worked many more summers after they were married, as RAY took various coaching jobs. HELEN served as staff director under BOB HUDSON for many years. As a young coach, RAY helped San Angelo Central High School to a state championship. The head coach at Central was EMORY BELLARD, who also worked summers at Camp Longhorn and was also Boys Camp director prior to BILL JOHNSON.

The family left San Angelo in 1969 for RAY's first head coaching job, along with serving as a teacher and athletic director, at Burnet High School. RAY took over a team that had been winless for its last two seasons. After his first season, Burnet never had a losing season, as he created a lasting legacy of "Spirit, Pride and Honor." During his time coaching he never missed a summer as he, HELEN and PAM lived at Camp Longhorn, and HELEN worked full-time for Camp.

Despite leaving coaching in 1978, RAY never stopped teaching, and the values he instilled in others as Boys Camp director carry on today. He greeted others with a firm handshake and a gentle smile and taught those he knew, by way of example, to "treat others the way you want to be treated." RAY and HELEN's home was always open to off-duty counselors for homemade ice cream, banana cream pies, a game of 42 or even emergency laundry when needed.

HELEN continues to bless us all with her hard work and dedication as director and heart and soul of CLASP since its beginning. HELEN keeps up with thousands of alumni and special parents, organizes Mini-Camps, and greets alumni and special parents with her warm and welcoming Camp Longhorn spirit. This wonderful CLASP newspaper and the thousand other things she does are exemplary.

Turns out he was in the room directly across from me and had gone to Inks. FREDERICK's middle school baseball coach had also been

Starting my son off to his own special CLH memories

On a rainy day this January, my wife TRISHA, son THOMAS and I were headed west on 1-10 to the Camp Longhorn Carnival in Houston. While the weather was not cooperating, I knew that we did not have to worry about the conditions at the Carnival. It is an established fact that Camp Longhorn still holds the patent on happiness, fun and sunshine, and I was confident that the sun was shining at the Carnival.

THOMAS, at five years of age, was having a little difficulty understanding where we were going and why I was so excited to get there. It is a little challenging to explain the concepts of special bonds and lifelong memories to a five year old, so I just started to list the things that I experienced for the first time at Camp Longhorn. I told THOM-AS that I learned how to sail; play pickle ball; all of the core swimming strokes; The Mile Swim!; scuba diving; archery; water skiing (slalomed for the first time); repelling; trampoline skills; the art of tetherball; and Church Mountain ... all at Camp Longhorn. To seal the deal, I told THOMAS that I met his buddy, Mr. COZBY (DREW COZBY), at Camp Longhorn. JEFF described to me, what seemed at that time, to be a magical, mystical place where he had gone the previous summer to attend camp. Summertime in Lamesa, TX is less about summer camp and more about long days helping your dad with the cotton crop. Needless to say, I immediately started lobbying my parents for a chance to go to this "Camp Longhorn" in the Hill Country.

The lobbying of my parents was successful, with a lot of help from my sister (SHANNON SCHILD-KNECHT CORBETT). As it turned out, SHANNON had also heard about Camp Longhorn and was a stakeholder in the lobbying effort. We both boarded a bus in Midland, TX in the summer of 1978 ... bound for Camp Longhorn!

Camp Longhorn turned out to be more, and better, than what I saw in my mind's eye. Five years as a camper and two years as a counselor were more than enough time to sear the everlasting bond of place and friendship in my mind. I have had the opportunity to return to CLH a few times over my adult years, and it is amazing how CLH has maintained its core values and appeal. All of the things that make CLH so unique are still there, but they have woven in just enough "new" to keep it fresh for each generation that gets to experience the special "place among the hills and dales."



KRIS KUBIK . . inducted into the Texas Swimming and Diving Hall of Fame

Kris Kubik was inducted into the Texas Swimming and Diving Hall of Fame April 6th in Austin. You can find his plaque installed at the University of Texas Swimming Center in the TSDHOF Museum along with Tex's plaque and display on the 2nd floor. Kris is a former Counselor and is married to Attawaytogo honoree April Russell Kubik. Kris Kubik served as the Assistant Coach for the University of Texas men's swimming and diving program for 34 years. Working alongside Head Coach Eddie Reese their teams combined to win a record total of twelve NCAA team championships during that span. The duo coached 54 individual NCAA champions, 42 NCAA relay champions, and 28 Olympians. Kubik also served as an assistant coach for Team USA in the 2007 Pan Am Games, the 2008 Olympic Games, the 2009 World Championships, and the 2015 World University Games. He was one of the founders of the Longhorn Swimming Camp and mentored over 10,000 swimmers throughout his years with the program. Kubik retired from coaching in 2016 and resides in Austin with his wife, April.



DRIVING IN 'Dallus' . . . a recent e-mail

The North Dallas Tollway is our daily version of NASCAR. The minimum acceptable speed on the Dallas North Toll Road is 85 mph. Anything less is considered downright sissy. It also ends in Sherman.

A trip across town east to west will take a minimum of four hours, although many north/south freeways have unposted minimum speeds





Passing on the Camp torch to my children . . .

When HELEN approached me at the Houston carnival about writing something for the Alum news, I thought to myself, "I'm not a writer, I'm an accountant, for Pete's sake. I am doing good to string together a few sentences for an Instagram post or tweet every month or so." But everyone who knows me knows that my number one weakness in life is the ability to tell someone no. So, I started thinking of different approaches to getting this done.

First I came up with a Top Ten List idea, ala DAVID LETTER-MAN, but I kept getting stuck somewhere between number 5 and number 6. Then I tried writing it from the perspective of a CLH parent, but that fell flat, too. I finally figured out the best approach was no approach at all, just sit down and get it done.

So, if you are prone to getting frustrated with poor grammar and run-on sentences, it's probably best that you stop reading here (if you haven't already) and move on to the next, much more "read-worthy" piece.

My earliest memories of CLH are not the memories of a camper, but as a sibling, getting left behind, as my older sister KARIN ANDERSON FISHER and her friends, such as AMY SCOTT FORTENBERRY and SCOTTY MACLEAN, drove away in buses headed to Burnet. Back in the late 70's, the Ft. Worth bus would swing through Cleburne, my hometown, and pick up the 1st Term campers in the parking lot of Ben Franklin. I longed for the day I, too, would board that bus and get to experience camp for myself. Stories of blobs and trolleys and hoss made camp seem like a dream- 3 weeks of pure fun.

My oldest sister, KATHY ANDERSON SAPORITO ended up going to camp, too, and then working as a counselor. Eventually, when Ranch Branch added a 4th term in 1983, I got my chance to experience it for myself. It was everything I had expected, and so much more! Many of my sisters' camp friends were counselors 4th term, so even though the whole camp was full of 1st year campers, I immediately felt at home among the faces I had pored over in their camp annuals. I couldn't wait to be old enough to work at camp myself.

Unfortunately, life gets in the way, and as school activities starting encroaching on my summer, a choice had to be made between camp & the activities. Even though I only got to go to camp for 2 years, I was hooked, and held CLH in a special place in my heart.

Even though I left camp, I was constantly reminded of the bond

it builds. Everywhere I went, I met people from camp. At Girls State, Student Council conventions, Youth and Government - it wouldn't take much conversation before the topic of camp came up, and you would recognize an immediate connection. I will never forget the day my parents drove me up in the circle drive of the commons at TAMU (back when you could actually drive on the campus of TAMU!) They were moving me in for my first year at school, by myself, without a friend in sight. Out of nowhere, I hear someone holler, "Strawberry Shortcake!" and I whipped around to find ELIZ-ABÉTH TAYLOR THOMAS waving her arms and grinning from ear to ear.

Now, I hadn't gone to camp with ELIZABETH because she had gone to Main, but she had gone to camp with a Cleburne friend, ELIZABETH JOHNSON CARLOCK, and we had met a couple of times through that connection. It turned out that she was living in the same dorm as me, and we ended up pledging the same sorority. She would also end up introducing me to my future husband. A camp connection made the first day away at college so much easier, and ended up shaping the rest of mv life!

Fast forward over 10 years, and, having kids of my own, I needed to start thinking of how to get them to experience camp. My husband had not gone to camp, or any camp for that matter, so explaining the importance of it to him was a priority. I decided the best way for him,to realize the value of camp was to experience it himself. We headed off to alumni camp, and after a day of fun in the sun, a night out under the stars (away from the lights of Houston, where you could actually SEE the stars), and a morning hike to Church Mountain, he was sold. Of course, once you have kids it seems almost counter-intuitive to send them away, with strangers, for 2 or 3 weeks. I will never forget some of my friends and their You're doing WHAT?" looks I got when I told them CHARLEY was going to camp for 2 weeks. And when I told them there is no electricity or a/c in the cabins? They definitely questioned my sanity. It was August in Texas! They couldn't believe I would send my 9 year old to a place where there was no way for him to call me, or for me to call him. But I knew that camp could be the best thing for my son, and it turned out I was right.

To fully explain what an impact camp had on my son, I need to share a little about him. CHARLEY had a little bit of that "Charlie Brown" thing going when he was little. You know what I mean, right? Not that he was constantly bullied, but he was picked on, and he had little self-confidence, and never seemed to catch a break. But my husband and I started noticing a change in CHARLEY when we would pick him up from camp. From the very first year, he was a happier kid when we picked him up, and that just multiplied over the years.

He was a 4th term camper, too, and something about coming off of that camp "high" and going straight in to the school year REALLY worked for him. The whole "Everybody is Somebody at Camp Longhorn" mantra took root in him, and his confidence grew. I believe camp gave him the confidence to be true to himself, and to believe in himself. I know the influence of men like BOBBY MANNING, BRIAN WEAVER, and MARK MAN-NING helped to shape the young man I am so proud of.

I know being able to go to camp and succeed at something, or to be able to improve at something, helped teach him the importance of hard work. If I doubt the impact his counselors and fellow campers made on my son, I just have to look next to his desk in his college apartment, where he keeps the memorial for his counselor PARKER. I recognize their impact, but clearly, so does he.

This year will be CHAR-LEY's 3rd year as a counselor. He will have celebrated his last 11 birthdays at camp, away from his family, but surrounded by 500 campers singing, "around the campfire you must go" and a cake custom made by the best Chow Hall staff in Texas. He will plan his summers around camp as long as life allows, and we will support him in that. Because at the end of the day, isn't the most basic wish we have for our kids is for them to be happy?

In the years since CHAR-LEY was a camper, our other 3 children have been to camp, too. BEN, ANNA & LUKE have each gotten to experience all that ČLH Indian Springs has to offer. ANNA and LUKE are still campers, and I still get just as excited as we start dragging out the trunks and going through the packing lists. Our motivation for sending the younger ones to camp has shifted somewhat; in today's world, it is imperative to us that our children are forced to "unplug" every so often; the time away from social media and Fortnight ends up being the best 2 weeks of their year.

We notice each year after camp, just as we did with CHARLEY, that our kids are happier and more relaxed then when we dropped them off. How refreshing that in a world that can make us dog-tired just keeping up with the latest trends and technology, CLH is still there, unchanged. Sending my 9 year old daughter to camp without knowing another soul was probably the hardest farewell I have had, but she came home with stories of new friendships formed and sweet counselors who were like the big sister she never had.

I will never forget when LUKE was 8, and a 1st year camper, and I got his first note through the mail. It literally brought tears to my eyes. It read, "Mom, I never want to leave camp. Camp is where the world ends and paradise begins."

This year will be ANNA's 5th year at camp, and we are planning her high school activities around camp. She can't bear the thought of missing out on Marine/Marina mud for vol-

leyball try-outs or band camp. It looks like those deep ties that brought me back to this place after so many years away have taken root in my children, too. My CLH story spans 35 years, and I look forward to (prayerfully!) adding many, many more years to that number. Attawaytogo Camp Longhorn!

COURTNEY ANDERSON BEASLEY, what a great story. It's about your earliest memories of camp and waiting and waiting until it was your time to get to go! It's also about your children and what it has done to help shape their lives. It's about self confidence, it's about believing in one's self and it's about happiness. COURTNEY, who was raised in Cleburne, TX, was a camper in 1983 and 1984 . . She now lives in Houston with husband RODNEY and their children CHARLEY (19) eight years as a camper and this coming summer will be his second year as a Counselor; BEN (17) and he was a camper one year, ANNA (14) and this summer will be her 5th year and LUKE (11) and this summer will be his 4th year. 



And, by the way, CLH should definitely add to "Camper of the Day" (where the camper of the day gets to run a radio show during rest time).

I felt lucky to have a memorable taste of what MIKE had experienced all the summers he attended Camp. It was over those summers, MIKE developed strong friendships with fellow campers and counselors from all over Texas. These men, to this day, still keep in touch, make time for each other, and remain tightly connected. They share the news of happy occasions and congratulate each other on life's achievements. And they come together-always-in times of sadness (but somehow, especially in times of sadness, they seem to keep each other and everybody came home to find him standing around them in stitches - MIKE is in the kitchen with the applica-

Two boys (and a dog named Scout) later, it was time to start thinking about sending my first child off to Camp (Camp LONG-HORN, not that other Camp that I attended and still love, but we have to make choices in life and this was an easy one).

Our first-born son KENAN was in first grade, and I could already imagine the sensation of his blue and orange excitement as he would be standing proudly for photos with his new trunk before climbing on the Camp bus to become a CLH camper like his dad, his UNCLE STEVE, his cousins MARK and DAVID ... until this teary-eyed Hallmark dream was almost overturned by KENAN announcing to us that he refused to wait another year!

KENAN said that he just couldn't wait until after second grade to go to camp like his cousins! He REALLY wanted to go to sleepaway camp after 1st grade! Big BOY! I recall a few whispered conversations with MIKE, and our relief to learn that most summer camps in Texas also start after 2nd grade (so KENAN was just going to have to wait like everybody else!), until that one fateful day, when we unrepentant about the irreverence tion he had found online (NOT

supposed to touch my computer angles: now our niece MOLLY without asking!), and completely filled out on his own ... to apply to a DIFFERENT Texas camp. One that took kids after the first grade. One that had AIR CONDITION-ING and elective activities (and mandatory salads. I thought that rule was pretty cool).

"] And I've still never been to Ranch Branch (sorry, Indian Springs) or C3! No, I did not go to Camp Longhorn. But, Camp Longhorn is family. And I'm pretty happy about that.

Anyways, I had a real life situation tonight where my first responder training, from 14 years ago, came into effect. I was visiting a friend that worked at a wine bar in Houston, and a lady fell out of her seat having a seizure. Nobody in the room knew what to do. I





immediately told the workers to put her in the recovery position in case she vomited and to call 911. I remembered because when we were going over the first responder training during the Ranger trip, you looked up at us and gave some very sobering remarks about how this would one day be real. It's not the first time I have used yall's training. At a restaurant I was running I had to give CPR to a regular having a heart attack, little over a year ago. I really wanted to impress upon you gratitude for the skills and understanding I received at camp. The structure at Camp Longhorn provides you a moral compass as well as an understanding of real life situations. In hindsight, my adventures at camp, and the ability to push myself past my comfort level were built there. I wouldn't have had the courage to backpack the JOHN MUIR trail alone or climb Longs Peak had I not been convinced to jump off the pamper pull or climb the rock wall. I would have never been able to float the entirety of the Buffalo river at flood stage had I not experienced sailing and getting caught in a late afternoon thunderstorm. I wouldn't have had the courage to do the things that I love the most, nor the knowledge to change the things that I hate. I just wanted to thank you for preparing me for the real world. Your teachings have made an impact, whether you see them or not. Attawaytogo for making thousands of lives better.

MEDLEY OF ROASTED VEGETABLES

Colorful addition to any meal!

3 small yellow squash

2 small zucchini

2 medium red peppers

1 medium onion

1/2 lb. mushrooms 1/4 cup olive oil

1/2 teaspoon dried thyme

1/2 teaspoon pepper

Salt to taste

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Cut squash, zucchini and peppers into strips about 2 inches by 1/2 inch. Cut mushrooms into quarters. Slice onion. Place vegetables in a shallow 9 x 13 or larger pan. Add oil and seasonings, mixing well. Roast vegetables in oven about 20 minutes or until tender crisp, stirring occasionally. *Can use any vegetables on hand and experiment with seasonings. Serves 8

MEME'S CONSOMME RICE

1 1/2 cup Uncle Ben's long cooking rice (Original)

1 large onion chopped medium

2 Tablespoons butter or oil

2 cans of double rich beef soup or consomme

1 small can sliced mushrooms

Pinch salt

Saute onion in oil until translucent. Add rice to cooked onion and stir together for about two or three minutes. Add beef consomme, mushrooms, and salt. Bake covered for 1 1/2 hours at 300 degrees. Uncover the last fifteen minutes.

EASY REFRIGERATOR ROLLS

(makes about 48 medium rolls)

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F., 20 minutes before rolls are

2 packages or cakes yeast, dry or compressed

2 cups very warm water

1/2 cup sugar

2 teaspoons salt

1/4 cup soft shortening or butter

6 1/2 to 7 cups sifted flour

In a mixing bowl, dissolve the yeast in the very warm water. Stir in the remaining ingredients except the flour. Mix in flour by hand until the dough is easy to handle. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease the top. Cover with a cloth; place in the refrigerator. (the dough keeps for about 5 days) About 2 hours before baking shape the dough into the desired rolls and coffee cakes. Cover and let rise until doubled in bulk (1 1/2 to 2 hours). Bake in a hot oven (400 degrees F.) for 12 to 15 minutes.

TREY LARY'S BEEF RUB (that can be used on anything)

1 T corn starch

2 T salt

4 t black pepper

1 t dried oregano

4 t garlic powder 1 t paprika

1 t granulated beef stock

Mix and store in container. For beef tenderloin rub lightly with olive oil. Coat lightly with dry rub. Preheat oven to 475 degrees. Cook tenderloin at 475 for ten minutes and reduce temperature to 425 and cook until internal temp at 125-130. Let stand about 20 minutes before cutting. Good rub for beef steaks, pork, chicken and fish
