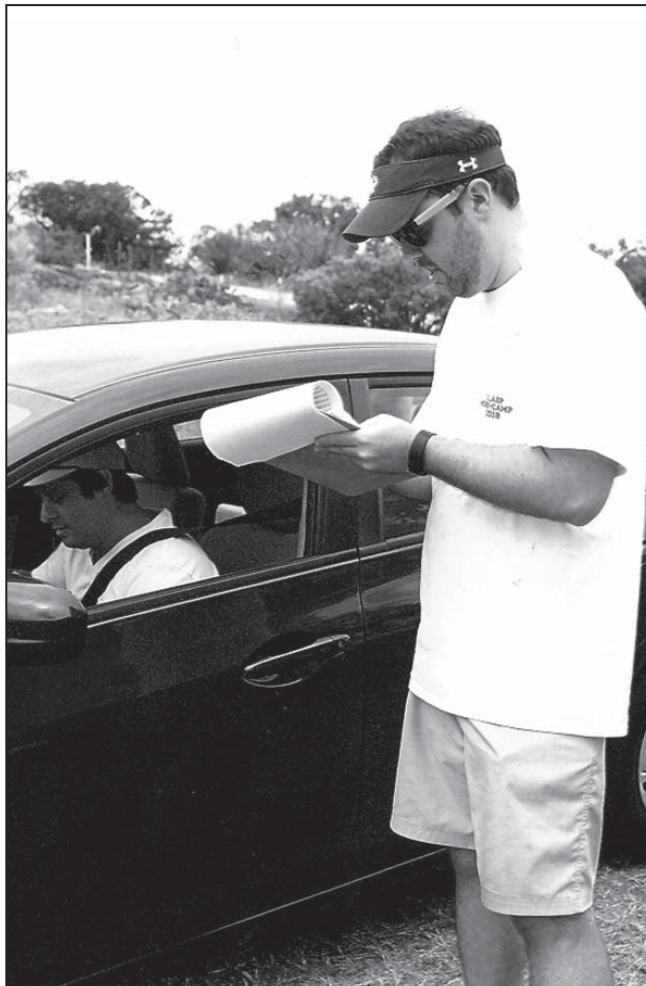

# How Camp Longhorn Made Me A Better Trial Lawyer

Not all of us lawyers grow up to become promising television sports broadcasters (hello, LINCOLN ROSE). Some of us go on to practice law (lots of practice, never perfect). And some of us still trudge down to the courthouse and try cases. Here's how Camp Longhorn made me a better trial lawyer.

The title of this article may seem strange to some alumni since I doubt there were many 8 to 16 year old kiddos, sailing on Inks Lake over the summer, pondering a legal career. Or greeting their parents on V-Day exclaiming how they learned all about being a lawyer. That would be strange.

And while my camp friends would not hesitate to describe me as strange, it was for other reasons, like being the guy in the Little Indian library after lunch reading Guns, Germs, & Steel or Atlas Shrugged, or some other light summer reading. (If you didn't go to Camp Longhorn that last sentence wouldn't seem strange at all - some guys frequently saw their friend reading books in a library; perfectly normal. Of course, my friends could see which book I was reading because I was in the OLD Little Indian library ... with open stalls.)

In any event, this article does not stem from my seven years as a camper but from my six years as a counselor. This includes the year between my first and second year of law school where I was asked (read: coerced) by ROBBY to be the Rangers counselor. Now, at that point in my life I had already officially "retired" from Camp Longhorn - I was 23, most of my friends were no longer counselors and I had already worked my self-proclaimed "fi-

nal term" ... twice. I was a college graduate, in law school, and really thought I probably needed a "real job" instead of returning to camp. Of course, I was wrong.

This one summer on the Ranger trip allowed me to synthesize my own camp counselor experience and pass this knowledge along to a next generation of counselors. I also had the benefit of returning as a counselor the summer between my first and second years of law school. Many lawyers will tell you that after that grueling first year of law school, you view and think about the world differently. I certainly did. I was able to see Camp Longhorn, and specifically being a counselor, through a new lens.

Ten years later, as I reflect on that summer I took the Rangers to Colorado, I realize that what I emphasized to those future counselors are also the skills that helped me become a better trial lawyer. Specifically, here are the skills I learned at camp that made (and to this day make) me a better lawyer:

**1. Public speaking.** Every lawyer needs this skill. Every person should learn and master it. Camp Longhorn counselors are required to do it ... frequently. Every counselor must, at some point, lead campfire. Older counselors host joint campfires like Carnival and Movie Night in front of hundreds of people and often are called on to speak at Church Mountain.

In short, to be a camp counselor you must overcome any fears of public speaking and you have multiple opportunities to practice it. Personally, any fear that I had of public speaking went out the window after performing a choreographed, lip-sync, dance to Queen's "Another

One Bites The Dust" at carnival with ROSS OLIVER and CHARLIE BRANCHEAU. Giving an opening statement to a jury or arguing to a judge is a piece of cake compared to that performance.

**2. Storytelling.** A trial lawyer's most important skill. Camp Longhorn has legendary stories told by skilled story tellers. Whether they are stories told to campers (like The Silver Haired Man, The Pink Eyed Indians, or my personal favorite, The SAM TEN BRINK Special) or personal stories of experiences with friends at camp (some of mine are titled Operation Goat, Uncle Remus, and The Finishers), storytelling is a core element of Camp Longhorn.

You don't need to know the substance of these stories to surmise that they must be captivating. Whether it's creating campfire skits, telling campers stories, or even old camp friends reminiscing about past camp experiences, storytelling quickly shines through as a Camp Longhorn trait. There is perhaps

no better evidence of this skill than the many stories, articles, and essays written by CLASP members that appear in the pages of this newsletter twice a year. Thanks, HELEN for putting it together!

**3. Organization, communication & persuasion.** The standard cabin size at camp is 12 campers, often from different backgrounds, many of whom do not know each other at first. Is it a coincidence that juries also comprise 12 people? Perhaps. But managing these kiddos, communicating with them, and yes even persuading them --"quiet guys, just like campfire"-- are important skills. Camp Longhorn counselors are set up similar to many organizations - there is a hierarchy and as you move up the ladder you are not only given more responsibility but also expected to train younger counselors. This is similar to a law firm, where older lawyers share the responsibility for training younger associates.

Finally, as most former counselors know, if you are put in a senior counselor

position (i.e., Wranglers) or placed in charge of an event (Mile Swim, Carnival, etc.), there are procedures to follow. Whatever you need to do, odds are that it has been done both the right way and the wrong way before. If it has been done the right way, there is undoubtedly a memorandum in the BCO written by the counselor who performed well.

Reading these memos and absorbing their message is crucial to performing up to expectations. If you are tasked with writing one of these memoranda, recording your message with clarity and simplicity for future counselors is essential. These are an integral component of a lawyer's job. In fact, upon reflection, JIMMY REEDER's renowned Wrangler Memorandum was almost assuredly written when he was a young associate. As I recall, it was formatted in what I now unmistakably recognize as a standard legal memorandum. It was also straightforward, informative, and intriguing. It was quite the memorable memo.

**4. Integrity.** One of

ROBBY's favorite acronyms "TURFUCIC"- The Ultimate Responsibility Falls Upon The Counselor In Charge. Another favorite saying; character is who you are when no one is looking. Camp Longhorn counseling is a hierarchy and system. For as many kiddos that come through camp each year, the managers must rely heavily on senior counselors for everything to run smoothly. This includes oversight of junior counselors. By necessity, this means doing the right thing when no one is looking (even though ROBBY probably IS watching you from up in a tree, silently waiting on the stairway to your cabin, or scuba diving under your water cabin - all real examples).

The State Bar is a self-governing body and good lawyers are truly committed to integrity and professionalism. We are entrusted with the great responsibilities to be zealous advocates for our clients while also serving as judicial officers of court to uphold the rule of law, work with our opposing

counsel, and seek truth. A trial lawyer's job demands integrity in all respects. A Camp Longhorn counselor's job does too - they are entrusted with looking out for a whole bunch of kids, serving as role models, and teaching both younger campers and counselors.

5. **Leadership.** Shakespeare's Henry VI's infamous line - "First thing we do, let's kill all the lawyers" was made by a character supporting an overthrow of government. Why? Because lawyers, by oath and training, are to uphold government. Regardless of field, practice, or even profession, lawyers are trained to lead. The skills above, along with leadership from being a counselor, more than anything else, helped me become a better trial lawyer.

The Ranger program in particular is instrumental in leadership training. As a result, camp counselors naturally gravitate towards leadership positions in what they do. In college I served as captain of my ultimate frisbee team and in law school as the editor-in-chief of my law journal. These are not coincidences. I sought out and was selected by my peers to these leadership positions. I give great credit to my experience at Camp Longhorn for excelling in these roles. And it should come as no surprise that many former counselors go on to be great leaders in their respective professions.

Even today, more than 10 years removed from being a camp counselor, I am still learning these skills at camp. Last alumni camp, G.P.'s closing remarks at campfire were about how Camp Longhorn made each of us a better person. As I looked around at the 150 or so people gathered at campfire, I was overwhelmed at the truth and power of

his words. Why would so many people, grown adults and their spouses, spend a weekend of their busy lives to come to Camp Longhorn unless it had some deeper meaning to them. The manner in which G.P. spoke his tone, his cadence, and his choice of words were all important. The message he conveyed was both nostalgic and inspiring. As a result, it was one of the more memorable campfires I have attended and, truth be told, an inspiration to write this article.

These are just a few of the ways that Camp Longhorn made me a better trial lawyer. I am grateful and thankful that I decided to spend most of my college summers and one summer in law school as a counselor. In hindsight, those decisions to return to Camp Longhorn were no brainers. But at the time they were made, it was no easy choice.

During college, and even high school, there was immense pressure from parents, school counselors, and a number of other sources to "get real jobs" or "pad the resume" with "real world experience." These pressures were great when I was a counselor over a decade ago. I imagine they have only increased exponentially over time. (Note: both my parents went to Camp Longhorn and both supported my decisions, and my sister MELISSA's decisions, to return as counselors summer after summer - Thanks, Mom & Dad!).

The truth is that no other summer job could prepare you better for the "real world" than being a Camp Longhorn counselor. Ultimately, I am blessed to have been able to work as a counselor for so long. No other job would have given me the same level of personal growth or character building. I can safely say

that camp was a great experience to learn the above skill sets, as well as many more, for any profession.

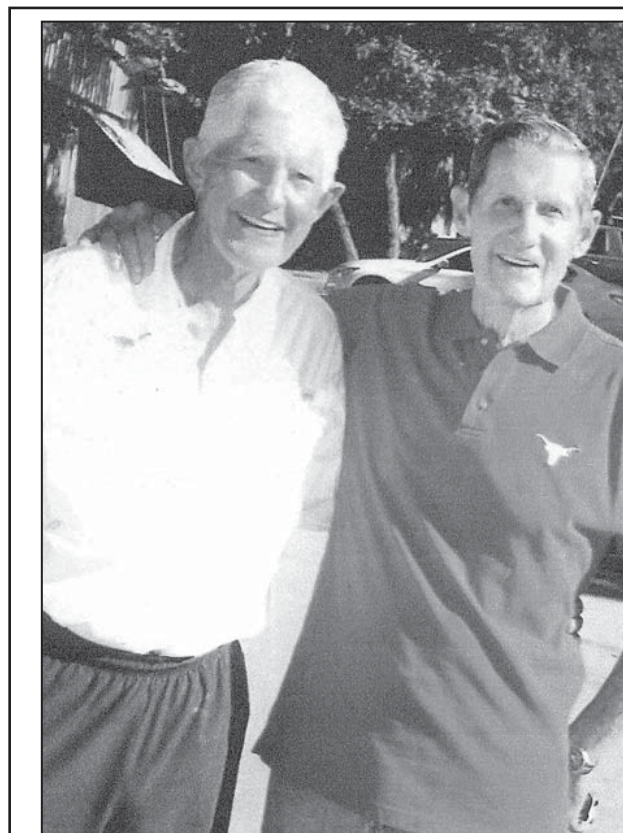
Further, I am now in a position where I frequently review resumes to hire current law students as clerks or summer associates. I would much rather see a candidate with one repeated summer job that they have grown into rather than a collection of different summer jobs over their college or post-graduate summers. It says more about a person if they are dedicated to a job that they truly enjoy, rather than jumping from job to job that does not offer the same kind of personal growth.

So, a note to current counselors and parents of current counselors - Camp Longhorn needs you and you need Camp Longhorn. Keep coming back.

In conclusion, I am so very thankful for my entire time at Camp Longhorn, but especially my later years as a senior counselor. Undoubtedly, the life lessons I learned at Camp Longhorn have made me not only a better lawyer, but as G.P. put it, a better person. Attawayto go!

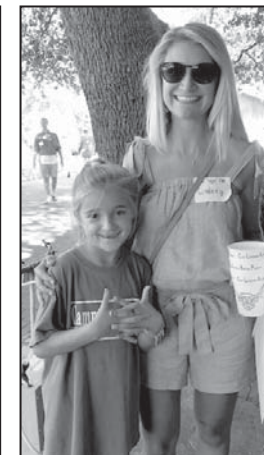

# Wide and deep roots form family's CLH family tree

In honor of 2019 being the 80th anniversary celebration of Camp Longhorn, I thought I would tell the story of how our family's Camp Longhorn tree, with its wide and deep roots was first planted and how it has flourished over the course of approximately 70 of those 80 years to now include the beginnings of a fourth-generation of the Bauknight-Bishop-Seale Family Cousins who have had the pleasure to experience a Slice of Heaven on Earth and the magic that is Camp Longhorn.

Our common grandparents, Dr. James Merchant Bauknight and his wife, Margaret Mingus Bauknight (my maternal grandmother for whom I was named), were the parents of 4 children—2 girls and subsequently, 2 boys.

Fortunately, for a long line of us "Bauknight-Bishop-Seale Cousins", our grandparents were very early adopters regarding the value and foundation a good Summer camp could add to the lives of children.

Unfortunately, Camp Longhorn for girls did not exist for my aunt, Barbara Bauknight Seale or my mother, Carol Bauknight Bishop, so my grandparents sent them to other Texas camps that did exist at that time and they just had to grow up wishing they had had the opportunity to be a Camp Longhorn Girl and living vicariously through their children.

## Establishing Roots

Fortunately, my grandparents had heard wonderful news about Camp Longhorn on Inks Lake in the Texas Hill Country that had established its roots in 1939 with the opening of the camp for boys. So, when it came time for their sons to attend summer camp in the late 1940's and

early 1950's, they sent my uncles, Jim Bauknight and Bruce Bauknight, to Camp Longhorn and thus, the seeds were planted for the Bauknight-Bishop-Seale Cousin tradition of attending Camp Longhorn each summer over the course of the next 70 years and still counting.

## CLH and Our Family Begin to Add Secondary-Branches over the Years

Over the course of Camp Longhorn's existence, which began with the seeds Tex and Pat planted, the Robertson's added branches to Camp Longhorn's main trunk over the course of its now amazing 80 year history—from the original boys camp on Inks Lake established in 1939, to adding a girls camp in 1950, the addition of a second camp in 1975—what we all called Ranch Branch (now officially Indian Springs) to distinguish it from what then became known as Main Branch (now officially Inks Lake), and of course the most recent addition of C3 in 2016.

Over the course of approximately 70 of the 80 years that Camp Longhorn has been in existence and has grown into three distinct branches that are held together by a core trunk that was planted and nourished by the Robertson Family, our family's Camp Longhorn Tree similarly grew into a strong tree with three branches of 11 cousins who were all connected by their common Bauknight grandparents—with our branches being the Bauknights, the Bishops, and the Seales.

As my Aunt Barbara and mother were the oldest two of my grandparents' four children, they were the first to have children and added 2 of 3 large main branches to the family's CLH tree starting in the early 1960's. Barbara and John Seale added that first main branch to the tree when they sent their son, Steve, and daughters, Shelley and Shane all of Jasper, TX to Camp Longhorn. Carol and Charlie Bishop added the second branch to the tree when they sent Margaret and Tommy to CLH in the

late 1960's from Victoria, TX, and subsequently sent their youngest child, Amy, to camp at Ranch Branch in its inaugural year - 1975 and she switched to CLH-Inks Lake after a couple of years. The third main branch of our family's CLH tree may have been added last but with time has certainly become the largest branch, with Bruce and Vicki Bauknight of Victoria, TX sending their four children, Julie, Jeff, Jenny, and Jill to camp at Ranch Branch (Indian Springs) beginning with Julie in 1976 and continuing on through Jill's first year there in the early 1980's.

## Continued Growth of Our Family's and CLH's Branches

As Camp Longhorn continued to grow toward having three distinct yet intertwined branches, so did the three branches of our family's Camp Longhorn Tree. As the original eleven cousins, connected through their Bauknight grandparents, grew up and started having families of their own, they all wanted their children to benefit from the same wonderful experience they had been fortunate enough to have at Camp Longhorn. As early as possible their children visited, interviewed, attended Camp Longhorn Carnivals, and registered to attend Camp Longhorn and then when their children reached that magical age of having completed 2nd grade, they eagerly boarded a bus or flew in from various locations around the United States and St. Thomas in the U. S. Virgin Islands to catch a bus to attend Camp Longhorn.

## Seale Branch

STEVE SEALE was quadruply-blessed with four daughters (just not at the same time)—LAUREN SEALE COLE, EMILY

SEALE, MAGGIE SEALE, and ANNA SEALE who all attended CLH-Inks Lake for as many years as they were allowed to attend as campers and then they went on to become counselors, CLASP Members and Alumni Campers. The girls are all grown up and Lauren has started a family of her own and has a daughter, KINGSLEE COLE, who is completing Kindergarten this year and probably counting the grades she has to complete so that she, too, can attend Camp Longhorn—my count is two more years until Kingslee will be our second 4th generation camper and 38th member from our Bauknight-Bishop-Seale Family Tree to attend Camp Longhorn.

SHELLEY SEALE GATLIN, joined her brother Steve at Camp Longhorn Main in mid-1960's, attended as many years as they would let her and came back for more as a counselor for several summers, joined CLASP, attended Alumni Camp and has many life-long friends from Camp Longhorn. Although a year younger than me, Shelley started camp earlier than I did and I was glad I had a cousin one cabin behind me to show me the ropes when I arrived as a first year camper. Shelley's son, HARRISON GATLIN, attended Camp Longhorn Inks Lake for many years as part of our family's tradition and was there at the same time as many of his cousins.

SHANE SEALE FOSTER, joined her brother and sister at Camp Longhorn Main in 1972, attending each summer as a camper, continuing as a counselor, joining CLASP, attending Alumni Camp and passing on the tradition and Camp Longhorn experience to her

three children, who hold the distinction in our family of traveling the greatest distance to attend camp at CLH-Inks Lake. Shane and her husband, Johnny, started sending their children, MILES FOSTER, PARRY FOSTER, AND SHERIDAN FOSTER to Camp Longhorn from St. Thomas in the U. S. Virgin Islands—imagine packing up three trunks and shipping them across an ocean to get to camp. Miles began his Camp Longhorn memories in 2006, with his brother Parry attending for the first time the following year, and their sister Sheridan getting there as fast as she could in 2010 and completing her 9th year as a camper this upcoming summer - 2019. Over the years, Shane and Johnny's children traveled to get to Camp Longhorn in the Texas Hill Country from St. Thomas, North Carolina, and Florida. Shane and her family have finally returned to Texas, relocating to Austin in the Summer of 2017 - just a week or two shy of getting Sheridan off to 2nd Term at Camp Longhorn. The timing couldn't have been better, as Sheridan was there last year to hug her cousin and my granddaughter, Emily, as she climbed aboard her first Camp Longhorn bound bus at Barton Creek Mall. Cousins are just the best, aren't they?

## Bishop Branch

MARGARET BISHOP, attended Camp Longhorn (Main) in the late 1960's and early 1970's and with both her son and now her granddaughter attending, she has spent many years as a CLASP Member. Her son JOSH BISHOP attended Camp Longhorn Ranch Branch, which it was still known as in 1980's when he first started, until such

they don't know how deep the roots run.

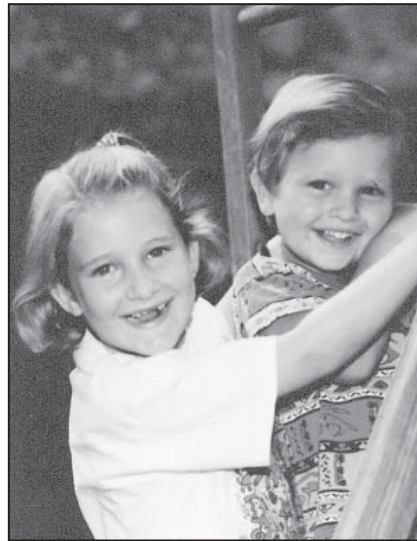

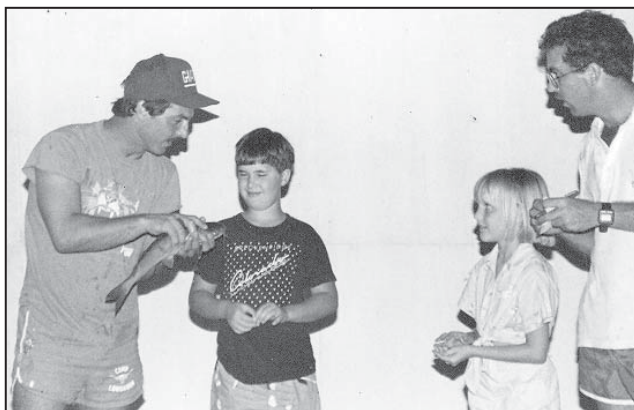

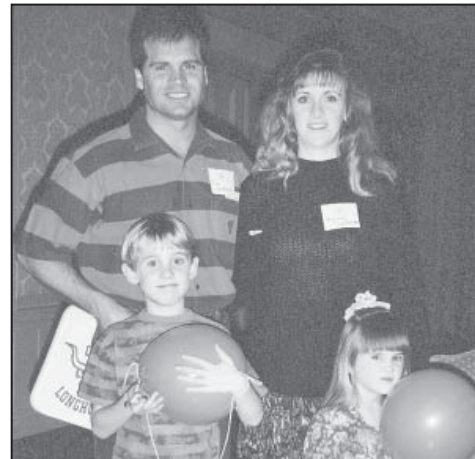

## What's Cookin?

From the kitchen of a favorite here at Inks Lake and all-time great counselor, GEORGIA PRIDDY LIVINGSTON. ### SALSAL CRUDA

3 tomatoes  
1 med. onion  
2 serano peppers  
3 sprigs cilantro  
1/2 tsp. salt  
Peel and chop tomatoes, finely chop onion, chop peppers and cilantro. Combine all ingredients and let stand for an hour. Great on fajitas!

### ASPARAGUS CASSEROLE

2 lg. cans asparagus  
1/2 c. slivered almonds  
1 can cream of mushroom soup  
1 1/2 c. Ritz crackers, crushed  
1/2 c. butter  
1/2 c. cheddar cheese  
Mix cheese w crackers. Mix with melted butter. Thin soup with 1/2 can asparagus juice. In greased casserole dish lay asparagus, then sprinkle nuts, then pour soup mixture over. Sprinkle cracker mix on top. Bake at 350 for 30 min.

### TAMALE BITES

6 tamales, cut in bite-sized pieces  
1 pound bacon  
Wrap each piece of tamale with 1/2 slice of bacon. Broil until bacon is crisp, turning frequently. Serve hot.

### STRAWBERRIES ROMANOFF

(Serves 2)  
1/2 c. brown sugar  
1 1/2 T. Grand Marnier liqueur  
1/3 tsp. cinnamon  
1 c. sour cream  
Strawberries, halved longwise  
Combine sugar, liqueur, and cinnamon, and whisk until all lumps disappear. Add sour cream, stirring to blend well. Put berries in stemmed glasses and spoon sauce over the top.

# CLH - Where T1D can't stop you from being somebody

I was excited when HELEN asked me to write a piece for the Lumnews. If for no other reason, this now marks the third consecutive edition that someone from Tyler has shared a story. We may have been "small town" but we were well represented! I went fourth term which was always bittersweet - I would spend my entire summer counting down the days to camp, but that also meant I was counting down the days for the start to another school year.

My time at CLH was definitely a highlight of my childhood. There is nothing unique about that as I think all alumni will agree. But there is a part of my personal camp story that is.

I started as a Snake at the "Ranch Branch" back in '84. It was difficult being away from home for such a long time (two whole weeks!) at a young age. It must have been the food from the world's greatest chow hall that kept going. The proof is in my first letter home that went something like this:

Dear Mom and Dad,

The food is good. For dinner we had roast beef and mashed potatoes. And green beans and apple crisp. We had bacon and eggs and pancakes for breakfast.

Love you.  
BOB

No "I'm having fun," or no "I miss you, how is the dog?" Just food. Only food. Nothing else.

My mom still reminds me of this letter every time the subject of camp comes up. Everybody talks about how one of the greatest things about CLH is that it stays the same no matter how much the world around us changes. Well I am happy to report that this is still true, at least with respect to

the bacon. My daughter just finished up her first year in the Pony cabin and she tells me that CLH has the best bacon in the world. It is good to see that CLH has managed to retain this title for at least 35 years and still counting ...

I mentioned earlier that my personal camp experience is unique, and it truly is. Everybody loves the chow, especially the apple crisp and bacon. So it's not my love of the chow that made my camp experience unique. But just days after coming home from spending my 6th summer at camp, I was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes over Labor Day weekend 1989. This weekend changed my life forever. The diagnosis brought on a lot of changes in my life, but fortunately in the end it didn't impact my CLH experience.

But imagine this situation - You have been going to CLH for six, fun filled years and all the friends you have made and cool counselors you look up to. And the next summer is going to be your Marine year. It is going to be your best year ever. But then you wake up one morning and all of this could be taken away from you because of a medical condition that is completely beyond your control.

Well that was almost my situation. No Type 1 diabetic had EVER attended CLH. Ever. Not in 50 years. If accepted back, I was going to be the first. Children with diabetes generally attend camps that are organized for the sole purpose of giving kids with diabetes the opportunity to go to summer camp.

But my situation was different. I had already been going to CLH for 6 years. Camp was part of me, and I was part of camp. In the end, CLH was willing to take a chance on me and I was accepted back the following summer despite

the change to my medical situation. I am so fortunate that I was still able to experience all those great memories of the Marine year - sizzling like bacon in the mud, waking up to whistles and a water house, and trolley bomb practice. I am so thankful to Nan and the rest of the CLH family who invited me back to camp even though I might have been reviewed as a "high risk" to the Camp.

The CLH spirit lived in this decision! Everything worked out great and I received outstanding care and help from the Pit Stop along the way. I finished out my camp career with 4 more years as a camper/CIT/counselor without a single medical issue. Well, aside from the occasional ear ache that I kept between me, myself and I to avoid the dreaded "red pin." I learned that lesson early in my camp career, and what a difficult lesson to learn when you have to sit on the sidelines at Blob for a week!

I am so glad that my post Type 1 years at CLH turned out to be positive experience for everyone and helped pave the way for other kids with Type 1 diabetes to attend CLH. Also, it may or may not have gotten me out of rest period a little early a time or two ....

In many ways, my CLH experience and Type 1 diabetes have gone full circle. I truly believe that the

time spent away from home during my early years at CLH taught me the independence and responsibility that I needed to handle the challenges of Type 1 diabetes. Also, in another bit of irony, I now serve on the Houston-Gulf Coast Chapter Board of Directors for the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation with long-time friend JOSLYN WELCH PARIS. JOSLYN and I met at camp as 4th term Ponies and Snakes and went all the way through camp together as Chiefs and CITs. Just one of the many examples of how we all cross paths with friends from CLH in all areas of our lives.

I am proud to be a CLH alumni and most thankful that I am able to share with this experience with daughter MADDIE who will be returning to 1st Term, Indian Springs next summer for her second year of camp. My son PRESTON is in first grade and will be submitting his application on June 1. After getting rewarded for about a dozen "yes sir's" and "no maam's" at this year's carnival, the self described "Merit Machine" is looking forward to following in the footsteps of his Dad, Aunt

(GREER GABRIEL DEL RIO), and sister MADDIE and joining the CLH family in summer 2020.

*This is such a special writing, BOB GABRIEL! You went from six years at CLH Indian Springs to another four years with type 1 diabetes and never had a problem. Just a "bump in the road" on your way to receiving your 9th year ring and more!! You were an excellent camper in those first six years and camp was delighted to have you back for another four excellent years at Indian Springs. BOB grew up in Tyler and now lives in Houston with wife LINDSEY and children MADELEINE (8) and 2019 will be her 2nd year at Indian Springs; PRESTON (7) and 2020 will be his first year at Indian Springs; MOLLY (5) and WILLIAM (4 months), both future Indian Springs Campers! BOB was a camper '84-'92 and a counselor in 1995. He is a CPA. A campfire lighter many times, BOB was Division II favorite in 1988. He graduated UT Austin. We thank you for such a special and interesting writing, BOB, and thanks again for taking time to jot down your thoughts and memories!*

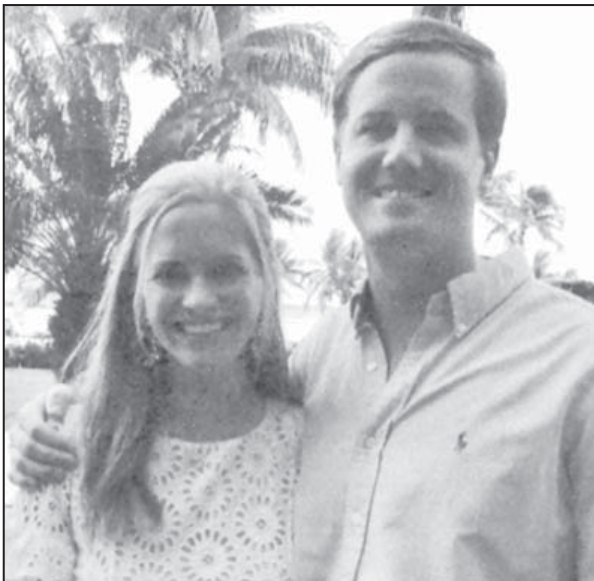

# Camp Longhorn, My Dad, Dr. Joe and a story about Kleenex . . .

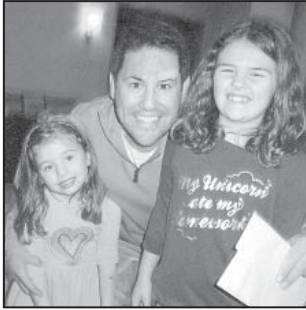

At some point, maybe the summer of 1982, my Mom started asking me about going to summer camp. Some of my parents' best friends in my hometown of Lufkin, had moved to the piney woods of East Texas from Dallas in the late 70's, and their kids went to Camp Longhorn. I'd hear them talking about how hard it was to "get in," and how manners were so important. To that end, my Mom has always been a stickler for manners, but the, "Yes Sir/No Sir" prep for the Carnival at the Old Stone House in Chambers Park near downtown Lufkin was like something I had never experienced before.

I was seven, and though I didn't have any clue what Camp Longhorn was, my chance to show off an "eyes up" firm handshake was coming, and "yeah" was no longer a part of my vocabulary. I could tell how much my Mom wanted her only kid to be able to go to this place, and I could hear from across the house at times, my Mom telling my Dad how much she hoped I would be accepted.

My father grew up on the West coast of Mexico, in far different circumstances than I, so my suspicion is he never even thought about what my Mom was saying, because going to summer camp wasn't something that could have possibly been on his radar as a child. I would later learn how true that would prove to be.

Apparently something went right at that Carnival, because I was headed to Cabin Zero in the Summer on 1983. I'm not sure why, but my parents actually took me to camp that summer. I don't remember much about that first day, other than it seemed like everyone else came on a

bus, and that my Dad kept saying in his relatively thick Mexican accent, that "This place seems very familiar."

At some point during the term, I guess I wasn't putting enough drops in my ears, because I got a pretty bad ear infection, and I had to go see DR. JOE. I'll never forget the whispery tone of his voice at that time, and as he started to examine me, he looked at "my chart," seemed to stare at my name, said it out loud, and then asked if I was the son of a surgeon named WALDO GONZALEZ? My mom would be proud, as I used my manners, and said, "Yes sir." He then looked me in the eye and said, "Your father handled tissue finer than any surgeon I've ever known." It's as clear a memory as I've ever had, but to be perfectly honest, I wasn't trying to my Dad's abilities with tissue, I had no clue what DR. JOE was talking about and wondered if that meant I would still be a red pen the next day, because I really wanted to blob.

Using my finest manners though, I made sure to say, "Thank you sir" and we agreed that I would tell my Dad hello for him.

Fast forward to V-Day, and as we were walking around camp and in front of Pit Stop, I suddenly remembered, and told my Dad, "There's a Doctor

who works there named DR. JOE SHEPPERD, and he told me to tell you hi, and that you're really good with Kleenex." I reckon DR. JOE and I thought differently about tissue.

Kind of like the scene in "A Christmas Story" when Ralphie cusses in front of his mother, and the whole world comes to a screeching halt, my Dad then made a fateful mistake when he realized why this place seemed so familiar. If you knew my father's child like naivete about matters such as these, and of course his accent, you would laugh even harder, but he looked at my Mom and said, "I KNOW THIS PLACE. I used to work here! I came from Austin to help DR. SHEPPERD see patients when he needed extra help! Is this the camp you were so worried about WALDO coming to? I could have called DR. SHEPPERD to see if he could have helped."

My mother is a 5'1" red-headed pistol from Houston, and I must say, in retrospect, I can't believe I got my early bird, because that was probably the worst thing possible my Dad could have said, and square in the middle of V-Day,

well, let's just say it was a one way conversation, and Yes Sir/No Sir wasn't necessarily a part on the discourse!

Last summer, twenty-five years after my first V-Day as a camper, I got to experience my first V-Day as a parent. My parents wanted to be there too, so twenty-five years after their first V-Day as parents, they experienced their first V-Day as grandparents. We laughed to no end at my Dad's performance two and a half decades before as we strolled in front of Pit Stop, and yes, my Mom stayed true to form, and with a wink and a smile, reminded him of what she thought about his minor omission as she worried so long ago about her son's chances to go to Camp Longhorn.

Camp memories really do last forever, and they're the best of memories. As I watch my daughter thumb through her annual on a weekly basis, I can only laugh at my Dad, and earlier last year, when my Mom pulled my old trunk out of the attic, my daughter asking me, "Why does it say 'TYLER' on the top." My response: "Well you can ask Mr. ROBERTSON why he decided to carve his name in my brand new wooden

trunk when you meet him at the Carnival in Dallas."

But that's another story, for another time.

JOE was the Camp Doctor and a very important part of Camp in the early day & and WALDO's father, WALDO GONZALEZ, was a successful, young surgeon that helped DR. JOE out when he needed extra hands at CLH. What a great story and thank you for sharing it with us, WALDO! He grew up in Lufkin, TX and now lives in Dallas with wife GRIFFIN and children

ELLISON (8) and she will be a 2nd year camper in '19 at Inks Lake, ELENA (5) and EISLEY (2) both future campers! WALDO was a camper '83-'90 and a counselor '91-'94. 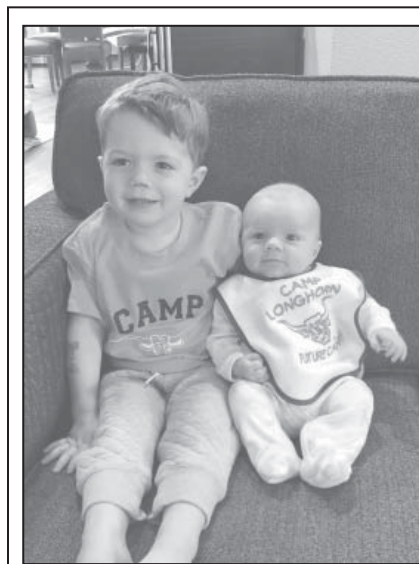
After a couple of hours, a policeman approached the cell and opened the door. She was escorted back to the booking desk where the arresting officer was waiting with her personal effects.

time that hard-core baseball forced him to move from 2nd to 3rd term and then finally usurped his entire summer with all-stars and out-of-state tournaments, even getting us back late for football two-a-days one year (don't think that hurt his feelings in August). In the summer of 2018, Josh's daughter, EMILY BISHOP, became the 37th member of our family and the first of a 4th generation of our extended family of Bauknight-Bishop-Seale Family to attend Camp Longhorn.

TOMMY BISHOP, Carol and Charlie's son, attended Camp Longhorn (Main) for the first time the second year Margaret was at Camp Longhorn.

AMY BISHOP SHELLEY, was the youngest in her family and having attended multiple V-Days and Camp Carnivals over the years, could not wait to attend Camp Longhorn. In order to absolutely ensure that she got in the first year she was eligible to attend camp, Amy decided to attend Ranch Branch in 1975, both her's and Ranch Branch's inaugural Camp Longhorn year. After three years at what is now Indian Springs, Amy made the switch to Inks Lake where she completed her 9th year as a camper and also spent several summers working as a counselor.
